2022 Presidents Meeting Highlights.

Year Group financial and non-financial obligations

The presidents meeting was well attended with representation from about 40 different year groups. The year groups were reminded of their financial and non-financial obligations and respectfully implored to meet those obligations timely.

30th Anniversary Mentoring Program

The 30th Anniversary Mentoring Program was discussed and reported to be progressing steadily with 360 mentees under the 1990 year group and 600 mentees under the 1991 year group. The year groups from 2019 to 2011 were assigned mentors from the 1989 year group to the 1981 year group respectively. The 1992 year group was identified as the mentoring group for the 2022 year group.

National Science and Maths Quiz

An appeal was made by Karen Bossman of the 2005 Year Group and a member of the

NSMQ Support Team to all year groups and individual Old Girls to support the endeavour to capture the Brilliant Science and Maths Quiz competition trophy.

WGHS OGA Tertiary Education Scholarship Scheme
